TAKE ACTION AGAINST DISTRACTION

Distracted driving joins alcohol and speeding as a leading cause of motor vehicle injury crashes. Research has shown that talking on the phone while driving increases the risk of crash up to four times, while texting increases crash risk by at least eight times. It is estimated that every 30 seconds there is a crash involving cell phones in the U.S.

A free one-hour class for the general public that is presented by professionals working in law enforcement, public health and education.

- Risks associated with driving distracted
- Emotional, physical, and financial consequences that distracted driving can have on one's life
- Practical strategies for reducing distracted driving habits and influencing others
